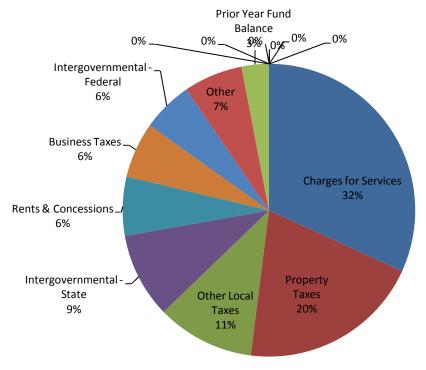
San Francisco's Financial Structure

- The City budget is approximately \$7.4 Billion for Fiscal Year 2012-2013;
- About 45% are self-supporting revenue enterprises like the Airport and the Public Utilities Commission;
- About 15% are partly revenue-supported enterprises like
 San Francisco General Hospital and Human Services Agency and receive General Fund dollars on the margin;
- About 40% are entirely General Fund like the Police, Fire, DCYF Departments.

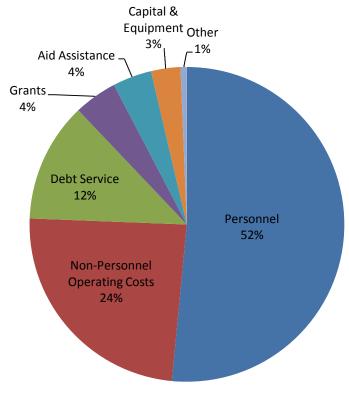
Fiscal Year 2012-13 Sources All Funds

Fiscal Year 2012-13 Uses All Funds





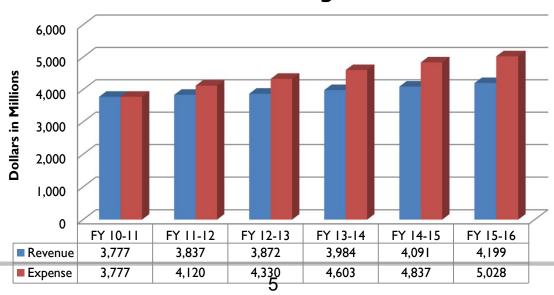

Five-Year Outlook Before Proposed Fiscal Strategies

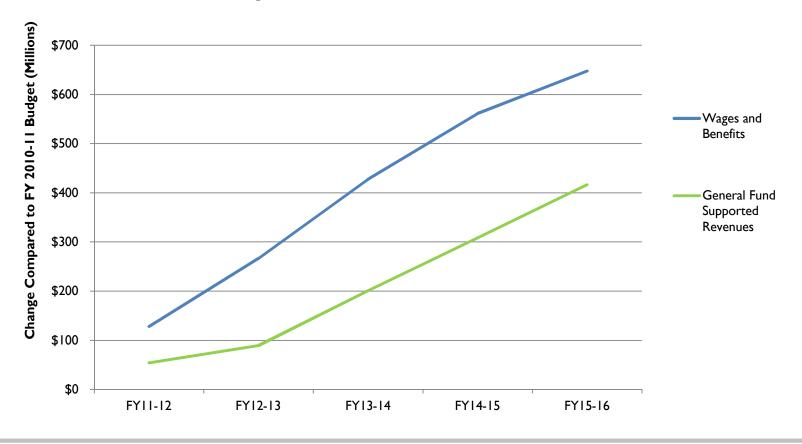
