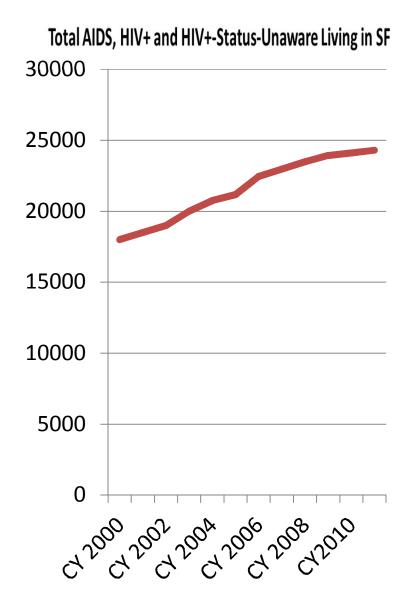
San Francisco's HIV/AIDS Care & Prevention System

Program Overview & Funding Shortfall

A presentation to the Budget Committee of the Board of Supervisors by the HIV/AIDS Providers Network (HAPN), March 27, 2013

Current Context

- 15-16,000 residents are knowingly living with HIV, ~6,000 don't know they are HIV positive
- 1 in every 36 residents of our City is currently living with HIV, including 1 out of 3 gay men.
- Over the past 13 years the number of people living with HIV/AIDS in SF increased by 45%
- Our City has lost \$14M+ in funding & services over these same 13 years – with no adjustment for inflation.



Current Context

- The Department of Public Health's HIV Health Services provides care to about 7,000 people living with HIV/AIDS each year.
- Of those, about 6,000 people received services funded in part by the Federal Ryan White dollars.
- Nearly three times the percentage of African Americans are infected with HIV compared to their proportion of our population.
- Homeless residents are four times more likely to be HIV positive.
- Persons aged 50+ comprise 50.2% of people living with HIV.

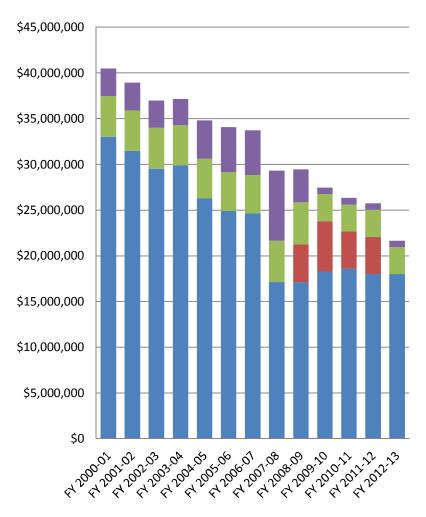
Current Context: Health Care Reform

HAPN, DPH, and the prevention and care planning councils have come together to form a city-wide task force to plan for a smooth transition to Health Care Reform

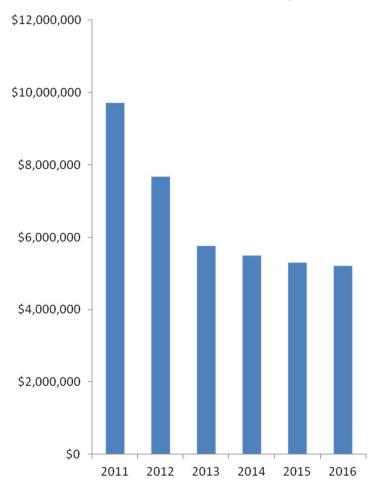
- HAPN secured a \$93,000 planning grant to assist the city with this work
- The task force's mission is to provide a seamless transition for the most vulnerable populations and help providers adjust to billing and other changes
- Ryan White is not going away: it will be essential to cover vital supportive service and augment care for those not eligible for ACA.

Federal Funds to SF for HIV/AIDS are Falling

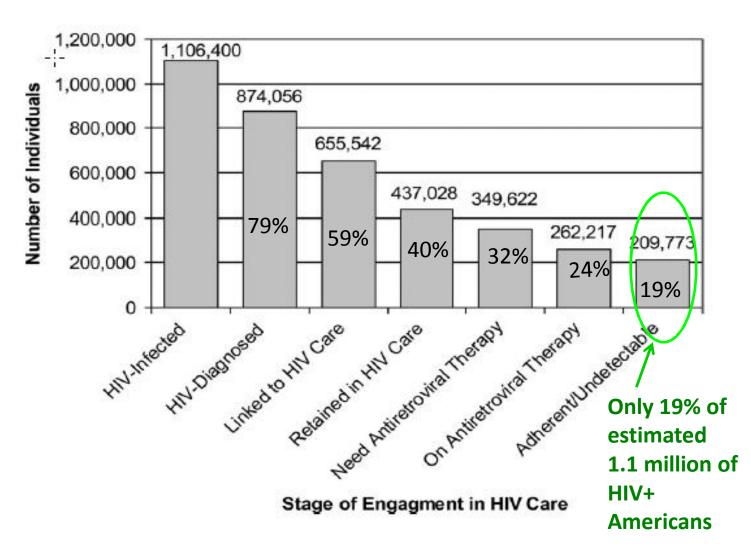
Ryan White Drop: from \$34M to \$18M since 2001



CDC HIV Prevention funds to San Francisco will fall by 50%



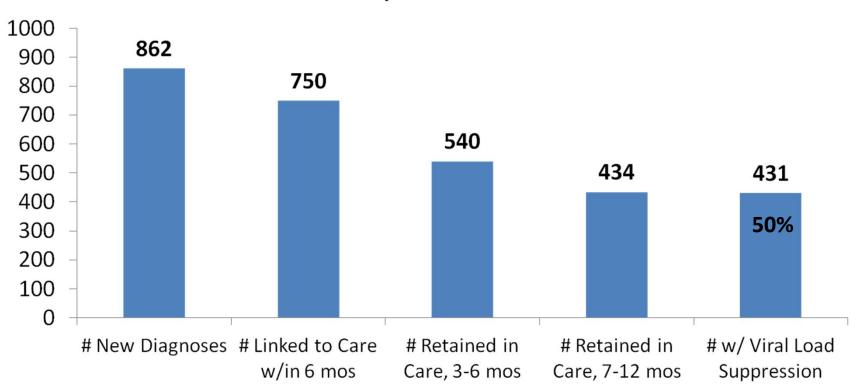
National Spectrum of Engagement in HIV care The Gardner Cascade

Our Cascade for Newly HIV Diagnosed Individuals, 2009-10, San Francisco

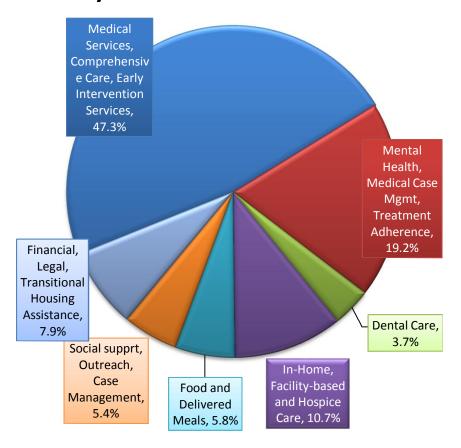


Our Model Works: Cost-effective, Patient-Centered Care

- Centers of Excellence for most vulnerable populations (Women, African-Americans, Transgender, Spanish-speakers)
- Culturally competent services target specific communities (21% of clients in HIV Health Service's care are African-American)
- Community-based agencies operate with a much lower cost structure than DPH
- Entire system designed to keep people OUT of emergency rooms and more expensive services!

Ryan White Services FY 12

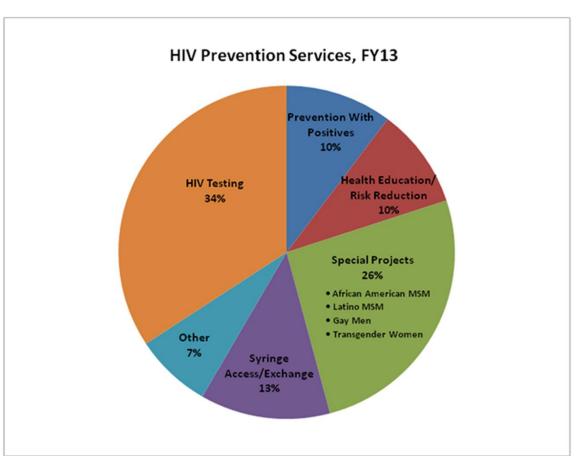

HIV/AIDS Funding NEED: \$5.4 – 7.1M

Shortfall in HIV/AIDS General Fund Programs backfilled in 2012:

- Former Ryan White CARE Act Programs: \$2.1 million
- Former Ryan White CARE Part D: \$250K
- Former CDC Prevention funds: \$1.88 million
- Total: \$4.23 million

6.8 % Cuts to Ryan White Care Act award to SF, March 1 (now).

Total: \$1.21 million

Potential Additional Sequestration effect (5% across the board cuts)

- Ryan White CARE Act: \$888K
- CDC Prevention: \$411K
- HOPWA Housing subsidies: \$428K
- Total: \$1.73 million

Shortfall in HIV/AIDS **General Fund** Programs backfilled in 2012:

- Total: \$4.23M
- Impact on CARE SERVICES (\$2.3M):

<u>Either:</u> a 50% reduction in funding for specific contracts, or **Closure** of those programs on January 1, 2014.

Shortfall in HIV/AIDS General Fund Programs backfilled in 2012:

- Total: \$4.23M
- Impact on PREVENTION SERVICES (\$1.88M):
 - -18.5% across the board cut to ALL Prevention Programs
 - -Devastating city-wide decrease in HIV testing, condoms, syringes
 - -Layoffs or program reductions at Mission Neighborhood, AGUILAS, UCSF Positive Health, API Wellness, Instituto, SF AIDS Foundation, the Jail and syringe access programs (examples only).
- Result: Increasing rates of new HIV infections

New 6.8 % Cut to **Ryan White** Programs

- Total: \$1.21 million
- Impact:
 - Affects 1,017 clients
 - Affects ALL agencies and programs
 - Retroactive toMarch 1, 2013
