BUDGET AND REVENUE TOWN HALL

Facing a structural budget deficit of almost \$340 million, the City and County of San Francisco is on the verge of making devastating cuts to services for our most vulnerable residents. Mayor Gavin Newsom will release his proposed general fund budget on June 2, and the Board of Supervisors will begin holding budget hearings the week of June 16.

HSN and Coleman invite concerned San Franciscans to a budget policy discussion on June 9. This event will prepare us for the upcoming Board hearings and look at longterm policy issues and revenue solutions, including a possible campaign for a revenue measure on the November ballot.
