- \* YES on A Affordable Housing Bond will help low and middle-income S.F. households
  Protect affordable rentals, prevent evictions, repair public housing, help workers and families.
- \* NO, NO, NO on C Requiring nonprofits to register as lobbyists will chill grassroots advocacy. Bureaucratic hurdles and \$500 fee will drive small organizations out of public policy debates.   The current law is unenforceable, and has no mechanism to prevent illegal short-term rentals.
- \* YES on I Slow development of luxury housing that is displacing Mission District residents. Temporary pause will allow the community to develop a longterm housing plan.
- \* YES on J Preserve legacy neighborhood businesses, arts groups and nonprofits. Help prevent displacement of nonprofits and protect nonprofit jobs.
